LOCAL AND GENERAL

Taken all round, Helensville Show was a considerable success.

Particulars of the annual picnic of the Warkworth School are advertised.

The Town Board has decided to allow the weekly half-holiday to remain as at present.

The anniversary tea of the Methodist Church, Dome Valley, will take place on Thursday, 10th.

Mr and Mrs McKinney have gone to town to receive their wounded soldier son. They will return on Friday.

The adjourned meeting of the Rodney Chamber of Commerce will be held to-morrow night.

Danthonia will bring a lot of money to Leigh and neighborhood this summer. There is a strong de and for the seed.

It is just over a fortight to the Port Albert Show, which will provide one of the biggest days that centre has ever known.

Miss Paterson has resigned from the Education Department, and Miss Barclay, formerly of the Dome Valley school, fills her position. Miss Shaw is not resuming at Warkworth.

The Hon. W. Fraser, Minister of Public Works, plans to pass through Wellsford, en route for Auckland, on Friday next, after visiting some Northern centres.

There is a mass of good herbage in the district, notwithstanding the somewhat lengthy dry spell preceeding the rain. The showers have renewed the green tint.

The jubilee of the Omaha-Pakiri Show is only a year or two off. The Show has been held annually for 47 or 48 years (we look to Mr Clarke, of Leigh, for correction.)

Mr Elliott was unable to meet his clients in this district last week, owing to the serious illness of his mother, who resides at Tauranga. He announces that he will be here this week.

Mr T. W. Attwood, jun., who has lately been attached to Civil's store staff, has enlisted. Messrs Geo. A. Anderson and Henry S. Cruickshank, of Matakana, are also in the 13th Reinforcement.

All the dairyfarmers in this district are well satisfied with their cream cheques and prospects. Many will proceed to get more land under grass and increase their herds. We trust that the necessity for a Herd Testing Association will not be lost sight of.

A large party of Auckland Boy Scouts has been camped at Whangateau. Local Scouts should have cooperated with the visitors, and also endeavored to surprise their camp. Nothing in the work of Boy Scouts is more interesting than night surprises of camps. Many of the thousands of Boy Scouts now at the Front learned valuable service lessons in those enterprises, or in blocking them.

It is specially important that every effort should be exerted to make the gift sale in connection with the Omaha-Pakiri Show a great success. This is a time for sacrifice. Those who are at the Front preventing the enemy obtaining a victory which would bring him presently to these shores, are sacrificing life and limb. Therefore get attuned to this noble spirit, and give not only what you don't want, but something that you do.

Industrial disturbances are constantly hitting the producer, upon whom Dominion prosperity and good wages all round depend. Recently an orange-grower in this district was promised 16s a case for a consignment to Christchurch. He shipped, but the consignment was held up owing to the cause stated, and then diverted from port to port. It had to be disposed of elsewhere, and the grower lost at least 4s a case, besides being subjected to a good deal of vexation.

Will there be something doing at Puhoi next Saturday? Will there? Anybody who can read the Patriotic Carnival ad. in to-day's paper and not realise it should take something and be well shaken. Puhoi is about to make the hit of the season. Amidst the amazing whirl in the "Town of Pandemonium," next Saturday it is to be hoped the sale of gift stock will be taken very seriously, and a large sum realised. John W. is in a fair way to achieve a great success. There could be no better cause. Do thou thy bit : and do it well.

One source of additional revenue is being overlooked by the Government. All newspapers posted to places in the Dominion have to bear a halfpenny stamp. The paper weighing an ounce has to pay as much as the paper weighing a pound. Why? The Government does not carry all parcels at a uniform rate. The only persons benefited by the present system are wealthy city proprietaries publishing large rewspapers, which would be none the worse for a good deal of judicious condensation. The one commercial and fair system of postage on newspapers is a charge at per pound : A newspaper sends all its "posteds" to the Post Office in one lot, they are weighed in bulk, and a charge made for the lot at per pound, no stamps being used. Our contemporaries should give this matter their attention.
