HENRY PHILLIPS' SONS.

As the late Malcolm Phillips lived 14 out of his 21 years of life in Warkworth he was well known to many of our readers, and the following extract from a letter received by Mr Geo. Andrewes of Kohukohu from his brother in the trenches will interest many:—"All speak very highly of poor Mac Phillips. His officer told some of the boys that had he returned from the journey he was on at the time he fell he would have recommended him for the D.C.M."

Malcolm enlisted in the 12ths, and was killed on the 28th September. His brother Edward, formerly in the Warkworth postoffice, is in the 24ths.
